We raised our global bond issuance growth forecast for the year to 17%, considering robust issuance through the third quarter and recent momentum being likely to continue through year-end. We expect more moderate issuance growth of 4% for 2025, since we expect high 2024 totals, slowing economic growth in 2025, and more modest interest rate declines than recent market expectations indicate. That said, we see potential upside to our 2025 forecast from higher investment in AI, growth in mergers and acquisitions, or stimulative measures outside the U.S. and Europe. This year's issuance surge has helped borrowers make material progress refinancing upcoming corporate debt: 2025 maturities for speculative-grade nonfinancial corporate entities are down 41% since the beginning of this year, with 2026 and 2027 maturities also reduced.

Global Refinancing: Reductions In Near-Term Maturities Continue Ahead Of Further Rate Cuts

S&P Global Ratings believes it is important to monitor long-dated megatrends. Such trends can transform industries and business processes in fundamental ways in the long run and create event risk in the shorter term. In a series of articles, we explore five major megatrends in North American corporate ratings: (1) growth in artificial intelligence, (2) vulnerability to cyberattacks, (3) increased adoption of blockchain and digital assets, (4) climate change (transition and physical risks), and (5) supply chain disruptions. These findings are not used directly in our base-case analysis; instead, they are helpful in identifying patterns and areas for further monitoring, investigation through scenario analysis, portfolio reviews, and other analytical methods.

Emerging markets will play a crucial role in shaping the global economy, contributing about 65% of global economic growth by 2035, with nine key emerging markets ranking among the 20 largest economies. In the coming decade, supportive demographics and technological developments could boost emerging markets' productivity and, consequently, economic growth. Furthermore, the energy transition and supply chain relocation will give these economies opportunities to leverage their abundant natural resources, ample work force and manufacturing capabilities. Despite these opportunities, emerging markets will traverse an evolving geopolitical environment marked by unresolved conflicts and other persistent disruptions, adding complexity to emerging markets' growth prospects. Despite their vast potential, per capita income will remain well below that of advanced economies.

Emerging Markets: A Decisive Decade

Maturity extensions and transitions from cash pay to payment in kind (PIK) were the most recurring drivers for publicly rated companies downgraded to 'SD' (selective default) since the start of 2022. When rerating issuers downgraded to 'SD', we raised about 85% of the ratings to the 'CCC' ratings category. About 27% of rerated issuers experienced a second default or selective default. Companies in the media, entertainment, and leisure sector and the health care sector drove over 37% of these selective defaults since the start of 2022.

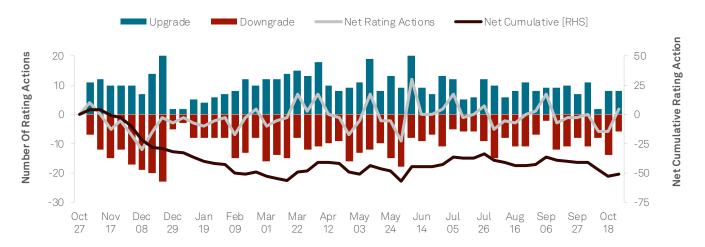

- Dutch RMBS: Here are a few "Key Takeaways" from a recent article:
 - Rate hikes and regulatory constraints on the Dutch rental market have not undermined the credit performance of buy-to-let (BTL) RMBS transactions that we rate.
 - o In 2023, Dutch housing prices dropped as a result of lower demand, before picking up again in 2024.
 - o We expect origination volumes to increase in the coming months as declining rates spur on refinancing activity and issuers diversify into new products.
 - o Non-call risk remains but could decrease, as origination volumes and evolving products provide encouraging signs to originators.
